Parts of the Mass

Epiciclesis:

The prayer petitioning the Father to send the Holy Spirit to sanctify offerings of bread and wine so that they may become the Body and Blood of Christ.

Consecration:

The consecration is that part of the Eucharistic Prayer during which the priest prays the Lord's words of institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper. Through this prayer the bread and wine become the risen Body and Blood of Jesus.

Praying with Body, Mind, and Voice

MAKING THE SIGN OF THE CROSS

We begin and end Mass by marking ourselves with the Sign of the Cross. Because it was by His death on the Cross that Christ redeemed humankind, we trace the Sign of the Cross on our foreheads, lips, and hearts at the beginning of the Gospel, praying that the Word of God may be always in our minds, on our lips, and in our hearts. The cross reminds us in a physical way of the Paschal Mystery we celebrate: the death and Resurrection of our Savior Jesus Christ.

Words in the Roman Missal

Consecration:

The dedication of a thing or person to divine service by a prayer or blessing. In the Mass, "con-secration" also refers to the words spoken by the priest whereby the bread and wine are transformed into the risen Body and Blood of Jesus.

Consubstantial:

The belief, articulated in the Nicene Creed, about the relationship of the Father and the Son: that "in the Father and with the Father, the Son is one and the same God" (CCC, no. 262).

Contrite:

To be repentant within one's heart and mind for sins committed and to resolve not to sin again.
